7.	Youth MP's	The Youth MP and Deputy Youth MPs provided a verbal update on recent activities and events including:			
		<ul> <li>A meeting had been held recently with Councillor Damian Talbot to discuss young people's issues in BwD and the key themes were Mental Health, Careers, Road Safety and Facilities/provisions for young people;</li> </ul>			
		<ul> <li>There was a common theme in feedback from young people in the youth clubs regarding mental health – this feedback would be used to raise awareness for the Takeover Challenge in November. Contact would be made with all headteachers in the Borough to see whether their school offered a school counsellor and would also be fed back to UK Youth Parliament;</li> </ul>			
		<ul> <li>The Youth MP's were keen to hold a careers event for young people with all training providers and companies offering apprenticeships in the near future to enable young people to see what opportunities were available for them in Blackburn with Darwen – this would be discussed further with the Exec Member and Director for Planning and Prosperity;</li> </ul>			
		<ul> <li>Road Safety – the Youth MP's wanted to start a campaign for road safety to influence young drivers of the consequences of dangerous driving and would</li> </ul>			

work with the Community Safety team to offer support;

• The Children's Partnership Board had asked Hamza to present the graffiti boards at the next couple of meetings. They also would like to use the

relationships curriculum packs that YPS have produced and include domestic abuse as a key issue to work with young people who were affected by it. Young people at Darwen Youth Club had recently been involved in the development of a cartoon designed and developed by Michael Linnell on drugs and alcohol and domestic violence, and when this was finished, Hamza would present it to a future Executive Board;

• Since becoming Youth MPs, the three representatives had visited many youth clubs in different areas of the Borough to talk directly with young people and would continue whilst in post. It was very clear from the feedback from the young people that they valued the youth clubs they attended. Valuable feedback had been received and the young people were informed that it was important they give feedback as it would be reported back to the Executive Board. Young people had also advised concerns about poor facilities such as play equipment and astroturf pitches and that they would like areas that were safe to play football and other games on.

Several Members of the Executive Board discussed the issues raised and offered support for the suggested initiatives, in particular the re-introduction of a Careers 'Speed-Dating' event at King George's Hall.
