Executive Summary

This report updates on the appointment process for the appointment of independent members of the panel following the end of term of appointment of Mr Paul Richardson, independent member.

Recommendation

The Panel is asked to note the progress for recruitment of a new Independent coopted member of the Panel.

Background and Advice

It is a requirement that the Police and Crime Panel for Lancashire appoint and co-opt to the Panel two independent persons.

As reported at the June meeting the Local Government Association has produced guidance on how Police and Crime Panels should go about appointing independent co-opted members, and following a process in the summer in accordance with these arrangements, a recruitment panel of three members of the Lancashire Police & Crime Panel, Councillors Paul Elms, Councillor Peter Gibson and Independent Co-Opted Member Altaf Baghdadi considered the application received and interviewed the applicant.

Unfortunately an appointment was not able to be made and arrangements were made to re-advertise the opportunity.

Stefanie Baron – HR Manager at Blackburn with Darwen Borough Council designed a recruitment campaign and drafted a new more engaging advert to try to appeal to a wider audience. This advert went live 5 December, 2016 on Blackburn with Darwen Borough Councils website and was also sent to all the Authorities in Lancashire to post on their websites. A corresponding press release was also drafted to be circulated by each Authority through their press channels to ensure wider reach of the campaign, all Authorities were encouraged to also utilise their social media channels too.

The advert for the role closed on Friday 13 January, 2017.

A further report will be made to the Panel at their next meeting.
