1. **PURPOSE OF REPORT** 1.1 For members to consider an application for a premises licence in respect of Cherry Tree Cricket Club, 459 Preston Old Road Blackburn BB2 5ND. 2. BACKGROUND 2.1 The Licensing Act 2003 provides that the functions of the licensing authority (including its determinations) are to be taken or carried out by the Licensing Committee. The Licensing Committee may delegate these functions to sub-committees. The Council's constitution has been amended to incorporate this. 2.2 The Statement of Licensing Policy indicates how the licensing authority approaches its various functions. 2.3 Where under the provisions of the 2003 Act, there are no relevant representations on an application for the grant of a premises licence or club premises certificate or police objection to an application for a personal licence or to an activity taking place under the authority of a temporary event notice, these matters will be dealt with by officers. 2.4 The Licensing Committee will receive regular reports on decisions made by officers so that they maintain an overview of the general situation. 2.5 Each application that comes before this committee will be treated on its own merits, and this licensing authority will take its decision based upon: • The merits of the application • The promotion of the four licensing objectives • The policy of the licensing authority, a copy of which can obtained from the Public Protection Service, 3RD Floor, Old Town Hall, Blackburn, BB1 7DY. • The guidance issued by the Secretary of State on March 2015 under section 182 of the Licensing act 2003

3 DETAIL

- An application has been made by CTCC Limited in respect of the **Cherry Tree Cricket Club**, **459 Preston Old Road Blackburn Lancashire BB2 5ND** for an application for a premises licence under the Licensing Act 2003.(see appendix 1)
- The application sought is to permit the following regulated entertainment:
 To permit the sale of alcohol Monday to Thursday (Inclusive) between 12.00 noon and 00.00 am, Friday and Saturday between 12noon and 1.30am, Sunday from 12 noon to 1.00am. To allow the premises to remain open for a further half an hour after the sale of alcohol ceases.
- 3.3 The application sought is also to permit the following regulated entertainment:

4 CONSULTATION

- 4.1 All responsible authorities have been consulted, advertisements have been displayed in accordance with the Act,
- There have been **eleven** objections submitted from residents in the area. They have raised the objection under the public nuisance objective (see appendix 2 objections).
- 4.3 Following mediation with licensing enforcement and environmental health the applicant agreed extra conditions relating to the protection of children and public nuisance.(Appendix 3 & 3a)
- 4.4 It has been determined that all objections from the public and relevant comply with Section 35(6) Licensing Act 2003
- 4.5 The applicant was given notice under Regulation 7(1)(d) Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings Regulations) 2005.
- 4.6 The required documents in accordance with Column 3, Schedule 3 have accompanied the Notice of Hearing in accordance with Regulation 7 Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings Regulations) 2005.

5 **POLICY CONSIDERATIONS**

This Policy recognises that longer and more flexible licensing hours can contribute to easing crime and disorder problems by ensuring that concentrations of customers leaving premises simultaneously are avoided thus helping to reduce friction at taxi ranks and private hire offices, fast food outlets etc.

The Policy will not set fixed trading hours within any designated area though the Policy recognises that stricter conditions with regard to noise control will be necessary in more densely populated residential areas. Additional security measures may need to be considered on premises which remain open to the public after 3:00am. Each application will be judged on its merits with the discharging of the licensing objectives being paramount in every case.

Unless there are good reasons to the contrary on the grounds of public disorder or crime prevention, shops, stores and supermarkets that sell alcohol will be permitted to do during the times that they would ordinarily sell other goods. It would be for interested persons or the responsible authorities to prove why this should not be so in any particular case.

As a general presumption, applications for licences to sell alcohol for consumption on the premises (including club premises) who wish to open between 10 am and midnight Sunday to Thursday and 10 am to 1 am Friday and Saturday will have their licence granted - subject to the rights of other persons to object and thereby require a hearing.

Any premises wishing to open for longer hours, or where amplified music is to be a feature of the entertainment which is provided, will need to demonstrate specifically within their operating schedule, how they will discharge the Licensing Objectives.

Applicants should be aware that there is no automatic presumption in favour of longer hours and all cases which are referred to the Licensing Committee the Committee will

consider if the hours requested by the applicant undermine the licensing objective. Where the Committee concludes that they do, the Committee may reject the application, or impose conditions and/or grant the licence with permitted hours which are different to those requested. In the interests of reducing crime, disorder and anti-social behaviour, the Council will prefer applications for public houses, nightclubs and registered clubs that demonstrate in their operating schedules a responsible approach to alcohol sales by ending such sales some time before the premises themselves are closed ('drinking-up time'). There is no obligation on the holder of a premises licence or club premises certificate to remain open for the entire period permitted by his licence or certificate. 6 THE THE LICENSING ACT 2003 6.1 The Licensing Act 2003 requires you to have regard to the representations, and take such of the steps as you consider necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives. 6.2 The steps you take are (a) to modify the conditions of the licence and/or to reject the whole or part of the application to vary the licence. 6.3 The conditions of the licence are modified if any of them are altered or omitted or any new condition is added. 6.4 You cannot however restrict the hours of the sale of alcohol to less than those authorised under the current Justice's Licence by virtue of Paragraph 11 Schedule 8 Licensing Act 2003. 7 LEGAL IMPLICATIONS ARISING FROM THE REPORT 7.1 Members are reminded that they must follow the rules of natural justice and they are bound by the code of conduct for elected members in licensing applications. 7.2 Members are reminded that they should have read or should hear all the facts prior to making a determination 7.3 Members are reminded of the consideration they should give to the Human Rights Act 1998, in particular Article 1 – the right to peaceful enjoyment of possessions, Article 6 - the right to a fair hearing, Article 8 - respect for private and family life and Article 10 - the right to freedom of expression. 8 **BACKGROUND PAPERS** 8.1 Appendices 8.2 Statement of Licensing Policy 8.3 The guidance issued by the Secretary of State on March 2015 under section 182 of the Licensing act 2003 8.4 The Licensing Act 2003. 

With regret, we find that we again, have to write with an objection, to the above named Club, on their requesting, a change to their present licence; seemingly, they want now to remain open until the early hours of the morning, for further entertainment, and no doubt the sale of more alcoholic drinking, it would also appear that, the Club, would now turn into a 'Pub,' of which it is more or less now! This being the case, we would never have envisaged living next to a Pub, its bad enough now, with the ARROGANT attitude, this Club, has to its near neighbours, over the period of time.

When we first purchased our house, we were informed that, it was in a 'nice' area, of residential standing, which we would hope it will remain so.

We have in the past had to put up with verbal, and physical abuse, admittedly not so much of late, but, with the change of the Club's facility this could revert back, in more entirety; even now we have to put up with, Drinks Glasses, cans, un-eaten food, in paper wraps, etc., flying over the hedge/fencing, into our garden; car doors slamming, very loud language, swearing, urinating, this also in the front of the Church, walling along the entrance pathway; cars/venicles parking along the hedge pathway to the Club, which in itself, could be a dangerous hazard, especially if a fire broke out, the Fire Tender, just would not get down, the vehicles arriving because of this change would we feel increase.

Visitors, even now "appear" to be observed of a loutish outlook and behaviour.

Also witnessed, is the congregation of 'visitors/members? Outside the entrance, in the car park,talking loudly,smoking and still drinking, we have been 'assured' that, this will not happen! but, it does still go on.


Re; Application for extended opening hours at Cherry Tree Cricket Club. Dear Sir / Madam,

We have just heard that Cherry Tree Cricket Club has applied for a license to serve alcohol and play music seven days a week until 1.30 a.m.

I live directly opposite the club across the canal and I and my neighbours receive the full impact of the music.

We have no objection to the alcohol license but loud music until the early hours is unacceptable especially coupled with the afternoon and early evening sessions we have to put up with at present in our own homes and gardens.

In the past I have had to ring the club several times to ask them to turn down the volume late at night generally to no avail. Even with double glazing and closed windows the boom boom boom of the music is unbearable and keeps me and my neighbours awake.

Last October we had to endure loud music until 3.30 am with a marquee on the cricket pitch.

The music is played loudly even during some afternoon matches when they seem to think that everyone in the neighbourhood wants to listen to their music rather than their own. For some reason DJ's in this country seem unable to direct the music towards the dance area only. If you are unable to hear the person sitting next to you then the music is too loud - this is the accepted level recommended by the HSE.

We don't want to prevent people enjoying themselves but they do insist on blasting out the music and, in summer with all the windows and doors open in the clubhouse, so that everyone outside can hear the music, it becomes unbearable - they even have speakers outside.

We believe they intend to hold Beer Festivals which, inevitably, will spill out onto the pitch. Surely, we are entitled to some peace and quiet in our own homes after 12.00 pm. We hope you will please place limitations on the music license. Thank you,

This is an email re the above Club and licencing application.

I strongly oppose the application to extend the clubs licencing hours.

I live only 400 yards from the rear of the club where the function room and bar is.

Last year there was a function there which went on until 3.30 am. The noise was horrendous. I made several calls to the cub asking when the music would be stopped - only to be replied to in a very rude manner by a woman telling me if I had a problem then I should phone the police. As I am sure you are aware, the police have more than enough to do without responding to noise problems. They were only able to attend at 3.30 am when the music finally stopped.

The idea of beer festivals - which will be an all day affair if not a weekend is horrendous. The noise will be on going with no respite for the local residents. This does not include cars/taxis and the increase in vehicles.

The application to extend its licensing hours every night - until 2.00 am sometimes is not at all acceptable. I work shift patterns which includes bank holidays and weekends including Christmas and New Year and my work involves making delicate decisions about drug dosages (for opioids and other very strong drugs). Any disruption in my sleep which will make me tired has the potential to naturally affect my ability to think coherently in order to make these decisions.

The noise will be detrimental to my health and well being also and there are numerous research articles to confirm how lack of sleep contributes to increased accidents etc. I am sure the council would not want to be held responsible for this. By increasing their licensing hours you will be doing just this.

I object very strongly to:

- 1. Live music until 1.00 am
- 2. Alcohol served until 1.00 am
- 3. Sportsman Dinners until 1.30 am
- 4. Any beer festivals.
- 5. Any "special days" being open and serving alcohol until 2.00 am.

The Cricket club has just had a new balcony with large glass doors opening onto it - it looks very nice but for residents living this side of the club, and with these large doors being opened - this just increases the noise to unacceptable levels.

The club has put up notices asking members to be quiet at the front of the club - I guess this is their way of saying they are doing all they can to abide to any rules already in place. As both you and I know,, when people have had a drink or two they may be unaware of the noise they are making. These people may also be able to lie in the next day when other cannot. Again affecting people's health.

We can already hear events at the club but feel that events finishing at 12.00 are enough to deal with.


We also understand that marquees will be erected and feel that people shouting will add to the overall sound output.
