Dear Board members, as a resident of Gillibrand st I was asked to represent the objection to the alcohol license variation that was applied for by, the Savoy Garage, 80 Blackburn Rd.

The reasons for this objection is due to the lack of information by the establishment. The locals of the area have had to suffer, due to litter and broken glass sold since the license was approved. Although these are minor offenses, we have also seen increase of public nuisance and crime related to license when it was introduced last year 2016. This is highly distressing to see as many children live in the area, during the evenings young adults regularly visit the store.

Below are the licensing objectives with point based on how each objectives have been failed so far with the current license.

The Act sets out four licensing objectives which must be taken into account when a local authority carries out its functions. They are:

1. the prevention of crime and disorder,

Crime and disorder have seen an increase in the area. As shown by the above data. Locals have suffered from alcohol related litter in their properties and alleyways, cans, bottles and broken glass.

There has also been three crime related instances shown on the crime map directly next to the establishment.

2. public safety,

- The three wards areas around the location have a total of $(34 + 24 + 24) = 82$ TIIG assault presentations at RBH since 2013 (3 years 3 months), equivalent to 2 assaults each month requiring emergency treatment at A&E.
 - There have been a total of 73 attendances to A&E for assault from May 16 to April 17, directly from the surrounding wards of Sunnystur, Earcroft and Sudell.
- There have been instances of theft that have caused distress as a result of the license.

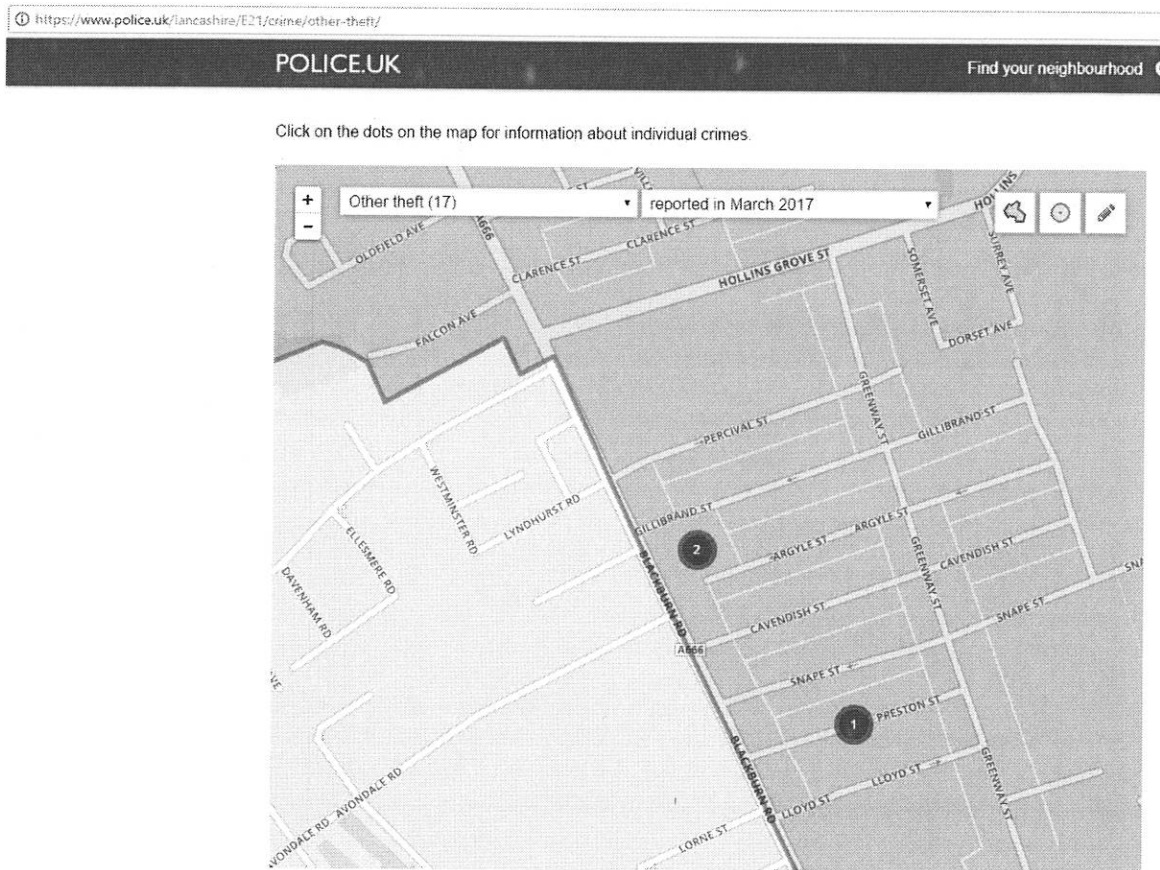
4. the protection of children from harm

Children during the day visit the store.

In the evening it is regularly visited by young adults as young as age 11.

Our point as residents is, we suffer greatly from societal issues already. In Earcroft alone we already have 23 license premises alone, only one of them is a Pub. We feel this variation only worsens the already alcohol and drug related issues the ward suffers. We must ask ourselves who is buying alcohol at 11pm onwards, are we doing a disservice to the public allowing our vulnerable access to dangerous substances so late in the night.
