1 WELCOME AND APOLOGIES

The Chair, Mike Murray, welcomed everyone to the meeting.

2 MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD ON 19TH MARCH 2007

The minutes of the meeting held on 19th March 2007 were agreed as a correct record.

It was reported that 100 Voices strategy to tackle cohesion issues would continue under the Council's new administration.

3 MINUTES OF THE EXECUTIVE MEETING HELD ON 16TH APRIL 2007

The minutes of the meeting of the Executive held on 16th April were submitted for information.

4 TRANSFORMATION OF PENNINE LANCASHIRE

Andrew Lightfoot, Deputy Chief Executive, carried out a presentation that outlined the Pennine Lancashire Transformational Agenda, which addresses specific challenges of the Pennine Lancashire area. Pennine Lancashire still contributes more than any other area to the Lancashire Economy and transforming the future would ensure it is a place with varied and distinctive character and high environmental quality and heritage which celebrates its cultural diversity.

It was reported that the transformational agenda incorporated the following areas:

- Connectivity Transport links to Greater Manchester and Preston, Pennine Lancashire Rapid Transit, transport links to employment sites
- Branding Major conference to launch Pennine Lancashire brand
- Skills and Higher Education Pennine Lancashire University: Blackburn and Lancaster – Burnley and Uclan. Workforce skills; delivery of Lancashire Skills Strategy in Pennine Lancashire
- Economic Development Integrated economic plan for Pennine Lancashire: Developing the knowledge economy, manufacturing and cultural industries; delivery of integrated economic development function across east Lancashire: LEGI
- Employment Land Strategic employment sites include Samlesbury Aerospace Park, Whitebirk, Burnley Enterprise Park, Medi Park and Michelin Technology Park

- Health Centre of Community Health Excellence; Teaching Hospitals
- Housing Market Renewal Attractive, sustainable and affordable housing
- Quality of Place
- Destinations/Tourism Fashion Tower, Racecourse Adrenalin Gateway and Goal

It was reported that the integrated economic plan for Pennine Lancashire would be submitted to the LSP for formal endorsement along with the Council's Executive Board. The final version and timetable should be available within two months.

Concerns were raised over third sector involvement but it was stressed that all partners would be involved and would agree the final sign off.

5 LAA END OF YEAR REVIEW MEETING

Habib Patel outlined the process relating to the Local Area Agreement end of year review meeting with Government Office North West which was due to take place on the 28th June 2007.

The Chair and one other representative from each sub group had been invited along with the community/voluntary sector and will be challenged on how the Partnership has performed against the LAA. It was also reported that there would be discussions on what the LAA will look like in the future.
