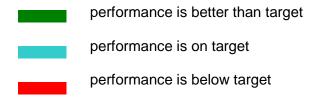
Delivery of our 2007/08 Performance Agreement

Monitoring of the Council's performance is undertaken using the PerformancePlus computer system. Reporting through this system a scorecard is generated (next page) using the following symbols to visually indicate performance:



Strategic Objectives

There are 95 indicators in total in total linked to our strategic objectives for 2007/08. 77 of the indicators were able to be reported on for the year (April 2007 – March 2008). Out of those indicators 31 have exceeded the target, 36 have met the target and only 10 were below target. This represents a performance of 87% of the targets towards the Council's strategic priorities having been met or exceeded.

In comparison to 2006/07 this is an improved performance with an additional 4% of indicators being above target and an additional 4% of indicators being on target. This is illustrated overleaf.

Note:

The strategic objectives for 2007/08 were the seven objectives that had been in use since 2005:

- Improve health and social well-being
- Create sustainable communities
- Improve the environment and housing
- Cut crime and improve community safety
- Promote economic regeneration
- Deliver positive outcomes for children and young people
- Deliver the highest quality services

These were replaced by the Council from April 2008 with three new outcomes priorities and two organisational delivery priorities, so this is the last report against these specific objectives.

The indicators used to measure performance against these strategic objectives were, in the main, derived from the 'Best Value' set of performance indictors. These have been discontinued by the Government at the end of March 2008 and replaced by a new 'National Indicator Set' (NIS). Future performance will therefore be measured using the new NIS and other locally determined indicators.
