## 13 Welcome and Apologies

The Chair welcomed everyone to the meeting and apologies from Councillors Rizwan. Mulla and Johnson were noted.

## 14 Presentation from MORRI- PennineReach

The Committee received a presentation from Mike Cliffe, the Council's Transport Policy Team Leader, on the survey by MORI with regards to the PennieReach scheme. The presentation outlined to Members, both the detailed findings of the survey and the methods used to conduct it.

Members were informed that:

- 60000 leaflets delivered to residents within 500 metres of the proposed scheme.
- Letters to business and posters.
- Overall response positive.
- Question: Would Pennine Reach proposals improve pt along the route?
  53.8% yes
  31.6% no
  12.7% don't know
- Question: How does the scheme affect you? 49.8% in a positive way 25.5% in a negative way 21.3% makes no difference.
- 54.6% use buses 49% on the Pennine Reach corridor
- 25.3% use a car and would not switch to public transport
- 15.3% said they would use buses if they were more convenient

The Officers answered questions about the Transport Plan, details on how MORI had selected people for the survey and the findings of the survey, resulting in Members having a discussion around those issues.

The Executive Member for Regeneration informed the Committee that there had been a number of objections to the original scheme including a petition and the Council had where possible met the requests of members of the general public.

## 15 Final Scheme for Submission

Faris Samin the Council's Technical Director then provided Members with a series of before and after maps to show how consultation with the public had influenced the PennieReach scheme.

Members where very pleased with the way Officers had listened to the publics opinions and where possible changed the plans to take into account their views.
