9. Key risk/priority – Growth Agenda – focusing on industry

The Chair welcomed the Executive Member for Regeneration to the meeting to provide Members with a presentation on what the Council was doing to generate growth in the Borough's industry sector. This is a key priority/risk for the Executive Member for Regeneration and was the final part of the growth Agenda the Committee has been looking at, having previously looked at the Boroughs Town Centres and Housing.

The presentation informed Members of the work the Council was doing to bring growth and jobs to the Borough. The Committee was informed that the Council had a plan for investment and growth, which covered:

- Infrastructure and Housing
- Business Investment and Innovation
- Employability
- Quality of Life
- Image and Marketing

The main areas of the presentation focused on:

<u>Infrastructure and Housing</u>

- Council's Growth Programme creating the conditions for growth
- Growth Team and 171-scheme development pipeline coordinates support for business by all technical services
- Liaison with developers shop window offices at Cathedral Square
- East Lancs Transport Masterplan M65 corridor, Blackburn-Darwen-Bolton rail, orbital route
- Town centres regeneration Cathedral Quarter, Bus Station, Leisure Centres and Health Centres, Darwen THI and 3-day market site
- Key employment & housing sites pump-priming and development Furthergate, Freckleton St, Cath Qtr 2, East Darwen Development Corridor
- New Local Plan 9,400 new homes, housing toolkit
- Core infrastructure network recovery & LED retrofit, drainage
- Sustainable transport solutions CONNECT plus with LCC

Business Investment and Innovation

- Business support Growth Lancashire/Boost
- One stop for business enquiries
- Assistance to Industry Grants
- Local procurement The Chest, Business to Business support
- Northern Powerhouse Investment Fund administered by the British Business Bank
- Inward investment target businesses initiative

 Grants awarded so far this year includes £5k for engineering firm Fairbrother & Grimshaw and £10k for Bees Knees (former Lloyds TSB site in Lord Street West – to become sport and music venue)

Employability & Skills

- MoU with Lancaster University and Blackburn College to promote business innovation, leadership and higher level skills
- Hive Business School linking business and education to address skills gap and prepare and enthuse the future workforce
- Fill current vacancies employment service
- Offer routes Traineeships and Apprenticeships tailored support for SMEs, public sector model of annual guaranteed intake
- Employment and Skills Board
- Target young people (NEETS) and 50+ Princes Trust pathways, Bootstrap, ESIF Volunteering project
- Promote health & wellbeing fit for work & fit in work, mental health

Members held a round table discussion with the Executive Member and the Officers present on boasting jobs and skills in the Borough. The Executive Member stated that recent developments from Euro Garages, Chubb and Pet Choice had showed that investments and jobs were being created in the Borough.

10. Town Centre - street begging

At the request of the Chair the Committee received an update on recent activity to reduce the amount of Street begging within the Borough's Town Centres. The Executive Member then updated the Committee on the work that the Council has been undertaking with Charities in the Borough.
