SUBJECT: REVIEW AND UPDATE OF FEES & CHARGES 2018/19 (1) LEGAL SERVICES (FOR PROPERTY RELATED TRANSACTIONS); AND (2) CORPORATE APPOINTEESHIP SERVICES

1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- 1.1 To consider the current property-related legal fees and charges in line with a previous benchmarking exercise with a view to updating those fees.
- 1.2 To consider the current fees and charges for corporate appointeeship services with a view to updating those fees in line with the rates charged in other local authorities.
- 1.3 To consider amending the threshold for referral of cases for Deputyship applications.

2. **RECOMMENDATIONS**

That the Executive Member approves the following fees and charges for 2018/19, and that the revised rates are implemented from 1st April 2018:

- 2.1 The proposed fees and charges as detailed in the fees and charges booklet for Legal Services (Appendix A).
- 2.2 The proposal to increase fees and charges for corporate appointeeship services to £10 per week (Appendix B).
- 2.3 The proposal to reduce the capital limit for referring service users to be considered for deputyship applications to the Court of Protection to £10,000.

3. BACKGROUND

It is Council policy to review fees and charges on an annual basis as part of its budget process and to implement the revised fees from 1st January each year, wherever this is practical. Since 2011/12 the scope of increases to be applied has been delegated to the Executive Member within each portfolio in view of other market forces and fee setting in neighbouring authorities.

Legal Services – Property Related Fees:

The property team within Legal Services carry out an important function in drafting legal documentation on land, planning, regeneration and highways (etc.) related matters. In cases where legal fees are recovered from the other party to the transaction, a standard fee is charged. This fee is usually a fixed fee, as determined by the Council, subject to reviews.

A review of legal fees was undertaken by the Executive Member in August 2009 however this review was limited to fees for s.106 Agreements and assigning/varying licences agreements. Since then no further reviews have been carried out and in particular no review has taken place of all work-types carried out by the property team.

A full review of the legal costs is required in order to bring the fees in line with current market prices. This is based on a benchmarking exercise carried out in 2015 with neighbouring authorities.

Corporate Appointeeship Services Fees/Deputyship applications:

The existing appointeeship fees were agreed in 2012. As part of the budget setting process, a review of all income was undertaken across the council especially in light of continuing budget reductions and service related pressures.

If approved, the revised fees and charges for 2018/19 will be published on the Council's website with a view for implementation from 1st April 2018.

Current Council practice is to normally consider making an application to the Court of Protection for appointment as Deputy for Property and Affairs once an individual's capital reaches £16,000. It is proposed that this threshold is reduced to £10,000.

4. KEY ISSUES & RISKS

Legal Services – Property Related Fees:

The core fees for property related transactions has remained unchanged for 6 years and over, until last year when some of the fees were marginally increased on some matters.

The recommendation is sought to ensure that the Council can properly recover its legal costs and receive value for money which is both reasonable and in line with market prices. It is also essential that fees are regularly reviewed to ensure that a healthy income stream is generated to the legal services budget.

From the benchmarking exercise, it was noted that Blackburn with Darwen Borough Council is overall undercharging on fees on most transactions compared to those of neighbouring authorities carrying out similar work.

The revised fees at Appendix A are based on what would be considered to be a reasonable or an average fee for that type of work.

There is a risk that income will fall as a result of lower demand, this is monitored and reported on throughout the financial year as part of the Council's budget monitoring process.

Corporate Appointeeship Services Fees:

Currently the Council charges £5 per week for corporate appointeeship services for all service users who are 18 or over and have at least £1,000 in savings. The charges in neighbouring authorities range from £5 to £10 per week.

 Increasing charges for non-residential clients to £10 per week would fall more in line with other neighbouring authorities.
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- Currently there are 68 residential & 51 non-residential appointees for this Council. For the non-residential the overwhelming majority (around 80%) have the same workload as the residential clients. It is only about 10 cases (around 20% of non-residential clients or only around 8% of all clients) that take up more time with telephone calls, letters, visits to reception, dealing with care providers and dealing with social workers.
- Currently, the Council charge is the same for residential and non-residential clients. In order to maintain this consistency and equitability in charging; and given that for the overwhelming majority of non-residential clients (around 80%) the level of workload involved is same as for residential clients; it is recommended that the rate for residential customers also be increased to £10 per week to match the proposed rate for nonresidential service users.
- As a large proportion (around 92%) of current clientele involves the same level of work, it is considered reasonable to continue with the approach for this Council of not differentiating in the levying of charges between residential and non-residential customers.
- It is proposed that weekly fee for appointeeship service users is increased from £5 per week to £10 from April 2018. (No charge if saving less than £1,000). Please see Appendix B.

Court of Protection Deputyship:

- The Council's current capital limit for a service user to be considered for deputyship (via application to the Court of Protection (CoP)) is £16,000. Council policy in a neighbouring authority requires them to refer when the service user's capital reaches £2,500. Another neighbouring Council refers all clients with £10,000 capital. It is proposed that this Council's practice is amended so that the capital limit for considering an application to the CoP for a deputyship order is lowered from £16,000 to £10,000.
- [The fixed costs that can be claimed by public authorities who are appointed as a Deputy are set nationally by the President of the CoP and the Lord Chancellor; they are included in Appendix B for information only].

5. POLICY IMPLICATIONS

These proposals are in line with current Council policy of revising fees annually.

6. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

The increased income anticipated from the revised fees and charges will be built into the Council's budget setting strategy for the 2018/19 financial year.

7. LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

There have been historically successive legal powers to charge for legal services provision but the most current legislation is Section 1 of the Localism Act 2011.

Practice Direction B (made under the Court of Protection Rules 2007) sets out the fixed remuneration that can be claimed by office holders in public authorities appointed to act as a Deputy by the Court of Protection.

SUBJECT:- Gib Lane, Blackburn - Proposal to install raised speed tables

1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

To inform the Executive Member for Regeneration of the proposal to install raised speed tables as detailed below.

2. RECOMMENDATIONS

That the Executive Member:

Authorise the Director of HR, Legal & Corporate Services to advertise the installation of the proposed raised speed tables as per the attached schedule and in accordance with the Road Hump Regulations 1999.

3. BACKGROUND

Following the approval of residential developments, all of which are to be accessed off Gib Lane, a planning condition has been attached for a s.278 Agreement for off site highway safety scheme (which includes raised speed tables). This is to be designed and implemented along the full length of Gib Lane.

The introduction of these measures will improve road safety and reduce the risk and severity of vehicular collisions.

4. KEY ISSUES & RISKS

No risks arising from this proposal have been identified. The proposal is of benefit to the social and economic well being of the Borough.

5. POLICY IMPLICATIONS

The proposal requires delegated approval from the Executive Member for Regeneration and Chief Officer. Road speed tables are required to be advertised in the local press and on site to comply with the Road Hump Regulations 1999.

6. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

The cost of making and advertising these raised speed tables will be approximately £40,000 and will be funded from section 278 monies.

7. LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

The necessary legal powers to implement this scheme are within the Highways Act 1980 as amended. The advertising of the proposals will provide the public the opportunity to comment/object which will be considered appropriately by officers and if any objections cannot be agreed then they will be brought back for a decision by the Executive Member.

The works are to be carried out pursuant to an agreement with the developer, if is of benefit to the public, under section 278 Highways Act 1980.




