Proposed Limited Waiting Mon - Sat 8am to 6pm

1 hour no return within 2 hours......Bolton Road, Darwen

Authorise the Director of HR, Legal & Corporate Services to advertise the proposed Traffic Regulation Order as per the attached schedule and make the order should no objections be made.

#### 3.BACKGROUND

Proposals for new restrictions have been put forward to improve sight lines at specific locations. This proposal seeks to implement these restrictions and includes No Waiting At Any Time, Restriction of Waiting and Limited Waiting on Cemetery Road, Bolton Road, Watery lane and Grimshaw Street, Darwen.

No risks arising from this proposal have been identified. The proposal is of benefit to the social and economic well being of the Borough.
