1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

To advise the Executive Member of changes and required approvals for the Local Transport Plan programme 2018/19, which was originally approved by the Council's Executive Board on 8th March 2018.

2. RECOMMENDATIONS

That the Executive Member:

- 1) Approves the revisions to the Local Transport Plan programme for 2018/19
- 2) Delegates authority to the Director of Growth and Development, in consultation with the Executive Member for Regeneration and Growth, to negotiate, seek and accept tenders subject to adequate budget provision
- 3) Delegates authority to the Director of HR, Legal and Governance to award contracts following acceptance of tenders
- 4) Approves the Highways surfacing Capital Maintenance 2018/19 detailed programme as agreed in outline in March 2018.

3. BACKGROUND

The Council approved its Local Transport Plan 3 (LTP3) in April 2011 with the following goals, to:

- Support the economy
- Tackle climate change
- Increase safety and security
- Promote equality of opportunity
- Promote quality of life, health and the natural environment

The LTP 3 also has a further cross cutting priority to promote the management of the Council's transport assets.

On the 11th April 2018 the Department for Transport (DfT) confirmed details of Local Transport Capital Funding for the 2018/19 financial year. On the 29th March 2018 the DfT confirmed details of the Council's "Flood Resilience Fund – Potholes" and National Productivity Investment Fund (NPIF) funding.

The Council has also been successful in securing Local Growth Fund 2 and 3 allocations to deliver

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Capital Highways schemes. The table below summarises the updated total amount of capital funding available in 2018/19:

Within the Executive Board report dated 8th March 2018, the 2018/19 LTP programme was detailed and approved.

LTP TOTAL EXPENDITURE 2018/19 (revised funding £10,784,791)

As of 16th November 2018, LTP expenditure stood at £3.219m (29%). It is anticipated that there will be no issues in delivering the 2018/19 LTP programme and 100% spend is expected to be achieved by the end of March 2019.

This season's skid resistance survey highlighted a number of issues resulting from the exceptionally high and sustained temperatures enjoyed through the summer of 2018. A number of options are available to repair this damage, including resurfacing and retexturing. It is recommended that remedial works are carried out on the following roads, during the fourth quarter of the current financial year.

3. BACKGROUND

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It is proposed to put existing and new taxi ranks into a single order. This will improve the future efficiency of the enforcement and administration of these taxi ranks.

The effect of making the proposed Traffic Regulation Order is to collate all existing and new taxi rank orders made in the Blackburn with Darwen Borough into a single document.

As part of this order revocations have been made which has necessitated the tidying up of existing restriction in the vicinity of this area.

4. KEY ISSUES & RISKS

No risks arising from this proposal have been identified. The proposal is of benefit to the social and economic well being of the Borough.

5. POLICY IMPLICATIONS

The proposal to make and revoke Traffic Regulation Orders requires delegated approval from the Executive Member for Regeneration and Chief Officer. Traffic Regulation Orders are required to be published in the local press and on site to comply with the Road Traffic Regulations Act 1984. Directly affected properties are consulted in line with current procedure.


