SUBJECT: Three Classroom Extension and Internal Refurbishment Works – St Barnabas & St Pauls Primary School, Blackburn

1. DECISION

To award to the successful supplier who has submitted a tender to provide a single storey three classroom extension and internal refurbishment scheme at St Barnabas & St Pauls Primary School, Oakenhurst Road, Blackburn, BB2 1SN.

It is proposed that the existing main building of St Barnabas and St Pauls School, Oakenhurst Road, Blackburn be expanded to provide an additional 3Nr classrooms and circulation space. The existing building will be refurbished to change the use of a classroom to a studio / library space, remodelling will take place to increase the footprint of the staffroom, classroom and adjacent circulation space. In addition the existing modular "temporary classroom" will be removed from site and adjacent areas made good.

2. REASON FOR DECISION

RDP: V2/16

The project was advertised online via the Chest as a single stage process. The tender was an open tender.

The evaluation criteria was based on 70% pricing and 30% quality, included a list of pass/fail questions and references relating to deliver of similar schemes. All tenders were evaluated and scored against criteria approved by the Council.

Six responses were received to the ITT, the details of which, and the scores are outlined in the table below;

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It is therefore the intention to award the contract to supplier F as they had the highest overall score.

3. BACKGROUND

The school currently has several small, classrooms that are below the recommended BB99 guidelines. This was identified as an issue when we enlarged the school with additional classrooms and PAN from 45 to 60.

The executive board approved this work as part of the Planned Improvement Programme on the 14th March 2019.

4. OPTIONS CONSIDERED AND REJECTED

A feasibility study was carried out of the available classroom accommodation and it was determined that some classrooms were undersized and there was also a shortfall in the number of classrooms presently at the school. It was agreed that to deal with this a new three classroom extension would be provided and internally a studio space, extended staffroom and extended classroom would also be provided. A number of locations around the site were considered for the three classroom extension and discounted and the location adjacent the playground was considered to be the most viable option with this adjoining the existing building.



SUBJECT: Re-roofing and asbestos removal work at Audley Juniors / Infant school

1. DECISION

To award to the successful supplier who has submitted a tender to provide Re-roofing and asbestos removal work at Audley Juniors / Infant school.

The works include the re-slating of pitched roofs including the renewal of the fascia boards and soffits, rainwater goods, re-pointing of parapet walls, replacement of defective leadwork, re-bedding of coping stones and upgrade of insulation. Renewal of asphalt / mineral felt flat roof areas, replacement roof lights and upgrade of insulation. Removal and safe disposal of asbestos within roof void.

2. REASON FOR DECISION

The project was advertised online via the Chest as a single stage process. A waiver was obtained allowing for a Restricted Procurement. Suppliers were selected to tender for the work who were specialists within this field.

The evaluation criteria was based on 70% pricing and 30% quality, included a list of pass/fail questions and references relating to deliver of similar schemes. All tenders were evaluated and scored against criteria approved by the Council.

Three responses were received to the ITT, the details of which, and the scores are outlined in the table below;

It is therefore the intention to award the contract to supplier B as they had the highest overall score.

3. BACKGROUND

RDP: V2/16

Previously this scheme was issued for open tender with a cost and pass/fail quality element, on return concerns were raised about the main contractor's ability to deliver the specified scheme and manage sub-contractors despite the quality questions being satisfactory. The decision was taken to proceed and it quickly became apparent that the contractor did not have the correct supply chain in place to deliver the specified roofing scheme or asbestos removal in the required programme or to specification, leading to the contract being terminated. As a result a waiver was obtained to retender using a select list of specialist roofing suppliers with a track record in the delivery of this nature of work.

4. OPTIONS CONSIDERED AND REJECTED

The school roof is considered to be in a poor state of repair and urgent need of replacement. Asbestos is present within the roof void and is considered a serious H&S concern.

Other procurement routes were considered, but to avoid a repeat of the previous scheme as it is of specialist nature and to maintain the programme of works, the programme being key to maintaining the operational continuity of the school, other options were considered but rejected.
