I bought my house in 1983 from my brother who bought the house as new build in the 1970's.

In all that time I have known this path to exist. Over time I have witnessed it travelled by people on horseback, bicycle on foot and briefly by motorbike.

To my certain knowledge, for more than thirty years this path is and has always been travelled by the general public for the purpose of walking to and from; schools, church, place of work, shops and the pursuit of leisure activities. People meet, greet and chat at either end of it.

The path is also used by professionals; Fire Fighters to deal with brush fires on the Scar, Council employees, to cut the grass, Electricity Company employees to check and maintain their equipment on site.

The path is part of and links into the pathways of River Darwen Park Way and Biological Heritage Site, locally known as 'The Scar', via a council constructed kissing gate. The labyrinth of pathways lead to just about anywhere one would wish to go to in Blackburn and Darwen and has been travelled for decades by people travelling to and from Work, Church, School, Shops etc.


The path is especially significant as it leads to the only official crossing in Lower Darwen where people cross Fore Street, walk down Duchess Street to the, 'Lollipop Person', where people cross Duchess street and go on to School, Work and the Bus Stop and vice-versa.

Originally completely open, Just part of the pathways running through the Scar, which, to the best of my knowledge has always been there. I cannot accurately recall when the wooden fence and kissing gate were erected, though I know that in the late 1980's it was still, 'open plan'. See Doc.003. The young lady in the picture is now in her 30's and the path is plain to see. It is also plain to see how the wall line of No.21 has been shaped to accommodate the path. It was in an effort to stop motorbikes using the path to access the Scar that the wooden fence and kissing gate were erected. Of course, the wooden fence was no match for determined bikers so a metal fence and kissing gate were built over the wooden one.

The path crosses land which is part of the River Darwen Parkway and Biological Heritage Site, and is publically owned, (Blackburn with Darwen ref. LAN83800). The other part is privately owned, (Walshorne Ltd. ref. LA196930). Originally designated as a play area and parking area the piece of land, ref. LA196930, has been the subject of several planning application. It is those applications which provide unquestionable proof of the existence of this path. All documents are publically available at Blackburn with Darwen Planning Department.

Highways, Transport & PROW Consultation

Application Ref: 10/11/0872

Site: 21 & 23 Swan Farm Close, Lower darwen

Proposal: One pair of semi-detached properties.

Officer:

PROW – There is a well used route across this land linking Swan Farm Close to FP112 and the river Darwen Parkway. Although not a definitive footpath the route is expected to have public rights (i.e. for being used in excess of 20 years). The applicant should be made aware that whilst planning permission may be deemed acceptable at this stage, the construction of the properties could be prevented under separate legislation if a member of the public opts to submit a claim for the footpath (to have it incorporated as a public right of way). The risk of this occuring can be at any time including after completion of the dwellings. It is therefore strongly recommended that the applicant incorporates a footpath linking Swan Farm Close to FP112 into the development proposals to avoid such an instance occurring.

Permission is sought for the erection of a pair of semis on land at Swan Farm Close.

The parking provision proposed is acceptable and complies with the advice offered in PPG13 and the Council's approved parking standards. The proposed eastern dwelling would in part be required to share a drive access with the existing neighbouring property (no 21) which is a private matter for the applicant and other residents to address. However, the Highway Authority and LPA do have a responsibility to ensure that safe and convenient passage does remain for the occupants of no21 on to and from the highway. On this basis, a condition is requested that an access and parking strategy be submitted to demonstrate that access to no21 would remain unobstructed by other vehicles as a result of the development.

There is also limited parking provision on the street for other properties but as permission for a similar development has been approved previously, the principles that the development would be acceptable have been established. As no resident has as a matter of right to park on the highway, this approach is still considered acceptable.

Turning to rights of way, it is strongly advised that the applicant revisits the footpath which runs through the site to see if this can be incorporated around the edge of the site. Whilst the Highway Authority raises no objection to the proposals, it would be in the interest of the developer to do this as a claim submitted at a later date by a member of the public could be an obstacle to the development starting (or if commenced, a costly exercise to amend the development). A worst case scenario would be that the developer would be required to remove parts of the development if a public right of way claim is successful after the development has commenced. As the footpath has been used in excess of 20 years, such a claim could be successful. It is however the responsibility of the applicant to weigh up the risks in this instance.

I would be grateful if the above could be brought to the attention of the applicant.
