SUBJECT: Proposed Traffic Regulation Order – Proposal to install raised speed humps - Shorrock Lane, Blackburn.

1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

To inform the Executive Member for Regeneration of the proposal to install raised speed humps as detailed below.

Shorrock Lane, Blackburn.....Raised speed humps

2. RECOMMENDATIONS

That the Executive Member:

Authorise the Director of HR, Legal & Corporate Services to advertise the proposed raised speed humps as per the attached schedule and in accordance with the Road Hump Regulations 1999.

3. BACKGROUND

Shorrock Lane is a well used through route which connects the A6062 Livesey Branch Road into the Mill Hill area. Meadowhead Community Infant School is located approximately mid-way along Shorrock Lane.

Following concerns about raised traffic speeds, a 20mph speed restriction pilot scheme was trialled in the Mill Hill area. However it was noted that speeds did not reduce and therefore a physical calming measure is being proposed in the form of speed humps.

4. KEY ISSUES & RISKS

No risks arising from this proposal have been identified. The proposal is of benefit to the social and economic well being of the Borough.

5. POLICY IMPLICATIONS

The proposal requires delegated approval from the Executive Member for Regeneration and Chief Officer. Raised speed tables are required to be advertised in the local press and on site to comply with the Road Hump Regulations 1999.

6. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

The cost of making and advertising this Traffic Regulation Order will be approximately £10,000 and will be funded from the Capital Local Transport Plan.

7. LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

The necessary legal powers to implement this scheme are within the Highways Act 1980 as amended. The advertising of the proposal will provide the public the opportunity to comment/object which will be considered appropriately by officers and if any objections cannot be agreed then they will be brought back for a decision by the Executive Member.
