

Residential disabled parking bay consultation

It costs the council £1,128 to put in a disabled parking bay. This includes processing the application, obtaining the relevant documents, carrying out an on-site visit, consulting with neighbours, erecting the pole and sign and marking out the bay on the public highway.

Q5) Do you think that there should be a one off charge to the applicant for putting in new disabled parking bays, and if so how much?

- Yes – for the full cost £1,128

Q6) If installing a parking bay remains free of charges, do you think there should be an annual (yearly) fee for people who have a disabled parking bay and if so how much?

There are currently no restrictions on how many disabled parking bays there can be on a street.
